





How closely have you been following news stories about artificial intelligence (AI) technology?




ONE-THIRD OF VOTERS HAVE USED GENERATIVE AI TOOLS

Please indicate whether you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of each.











Do you think that advancements in AI will overall lead to there being more jobs for people or fewer jobs?











Would you be more or less likely to support a candidate for office if they support increasing regulation on artificial intelligence (AI) technology, or would it make no difference?














