Changing topics now and thinking about public safety and law and order... Please read the following two statements and then answer some more questions.

[SPLIT C - CRIME PREVENTION]

Democrats say that the pandemic and economic upheaval of the last few years have put unprecedented stress on our communities, and they are working to make Colorado safer by investing in solutions that prevent crime before it happens - like education, affordable housing, and mental health treatment - while making sure law enforcement have the tools they need to crack down on violent criminals. Meanwhile, instead of working to find solutions, Republicans are playing political games and opposing investments in the things that we know work to prevent crime because they want to protect tax cuts for wealthy Coloradans.

[SPLIT D - GOP HIT]

Democrats say that Republicans like to talk about law and order, but the chairwoman of the Colorado Republican Party was the president of a far-right militia that has threatened violence to overturn the 2020 election. Republican leaders like Donald Trump and Lauren Boebert have opposed any efforts to keep guns out of our schools and assault weapons out of the hands of criminals. They turned a blind eye on the recent killing spree by a far-right extremist who held deeply racist and sexist views. And now they even want to give pardons to the rioters who assaulted the U.S. Capitol on January 6th, leaving five police officers dead.

Republicans say that Colorado is facing a tsunami of violent crime because Democrats have passed permissive policies that tie the hands of law enforcement and prioritize repeat criminal offenders over families, victims, and public safety. Democrats have reduced penalties for criminals who commit violent felonies like rape and murder and changed possession of fentanyl from a felony to a misdemeanor, putting more criminals on the street and leading to our public places being overrun by addicts and crime. As a result, Colorado's violent crime rate is growing 11 times faster than the national average.
